

THE NEXT GENERATION PROGRAM BY NCBJ

2022 General Information

The NCBJ will host the 13th Next Generation Program at its Annual Meeting in Orlando, from October 19 through October 22, 2022. The program will host up to 40 up-and-coming bankruptcy practitioners for exclusive NextGen events including:

- a judicial roundtable event featuring bankruptcy judges from across the nation;
- a small-group lunch with experienced bankruptcy practitioners;
- a networking reception and dinner to build contacts and relationships with NextGen alumni;
- a social outing to discover Indianapolis with NextGen'rs and judges; and
- future opportunities to participate as panelists with judges and other practitioners in educational offerings during the NCBJ Annual Meetings.

Nominations will be accepted through **May 16, 2022**.

Participants must have 5-10 years of experience and, subject to demand, only one attorney from any single law firm may participate. The cost of attendance at the NCBJ Annual Meeting must be borne by the participant or his or her law firm, but no additional cost will be incurred to attend the Next Generation judicial roundtable or the networking or reunion receptions. There may be extra costs for optional events, including the dinner and social outing. Scholarships will be available to qualified candidates.

2022 NCBJ Next Generation Nomination Qualifications

Law firms, government agencies, and bankruptcy judges are invited to nominate program participants. The program is designed to host up to forty bankruptcy practitioners.



2022 APPLICATION DEADLINE

TUESDAY, MAY 16TH

Qualifications for Participation in the 2022 Next Generation Program:

- Five to ten years of experience practicing law (including clerkships);
- devote at least fifty percent of his/her practice to bankruptcy cases;
- demonstrate legal excellence in the practice of bankruptcy law;
- display a serious commitment to principles of civility, ethics and professionalism; and
- demonstrate commitment to the continued educational development of bankruptcy professionals and to professional activities that will benefit the public, members of the bar and the court system.

Subject to demand, only one attorney from any single law firm or agency may participate in the 2022 Program.

Costs for Participation in the 2022 Program:

The cost of the participant's attendance at the Annual Meeting must be borne by the participant or his or her employer, but no additional cost will be incurred to attend the Next Generation events. There may be extra costs for optional events, including the alumni dinner and social outing.

We anticipate that, consistent with past years, NCBJ registration fee waivers, as well as scholarships to defray part of the cost (up to 50% of eligible expenses, not to exceed \$1,500.00), will be available to the first five eligible applicants. To qualify for a scholarship and a fee waiver, an applicant must earn less than \$85,000.00 gross income per year. To be considered for these subsidies, a request attesting to the nominee's qualifications must accompany the nomination.

How to Nominate:

Nominations will be accepted through **Monday, May 16, 2022**. Nominees whose applications are submitted timely will be selected randomly through a computerized lottery program, and qualified candidates randomly selected will receive an invitation to participate.

Each nomination must include a completed data sheet, a blank copy of which is attached, along with a cover letter from an authorized partner of the law firm, senior attorney of a governmental agency, or bankruptcy judge, attesting to the qualifications of the nominee to be a Next Generation Program participant. This cover letter is critical to the nomination package, so please do not forget to include it. Lawyers in firms with five or fewer attorneys may self-nominate, but must fulfill the eligibility requirements.
